



**“Translatology between quality management and translation criticism”**

**Poznań, 10-11 March 2016**

**Call for papers**

What is a correct translation? Is the quality of translation assessable? If it is, then what criteria should be employed—high standards of excellence, a high level of fidelity and accuracy with regard to the original text, or rather client satisfaction? What proves decisive for literary translations? Are there any objective methods of qualitative research, or are they entirely contingent upon a given field, form and pragmatic conditionings of particular translation processes. To what extent is the management of quality in translation advisable? What is framed within the context of evaluation, thus understood, is the role as played by and given to translation criticism? What models of translation criticism contribute to establishing adequate evaluative criteria in the above context?

These are only some questions we would like to submit to further discussion during an international conference organized under the aegis of the Institute of German Studies, at Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań. The conference takes as its theme and main title “Translatology between quality management and translation criticism”. Participants with interest in this vast field, both theoreticians and practitioners from all relevant disciplines, are welcome to send their abstracts and proposals.

The conference topics include, but are not limited to:

- evaluative criteria for quality translation
- optimization of the verification of translation (language correction and specialist proofreading)
- quality standards in translation services (PN-EN 15038) and their role in the optimization of the translation process
- standardization of terminologies

- computer-based translation
- interpreting and the question of quality
- quality management in teaching interpreters and translators
- fidelity and accuracy in translation
- stylistic norms
- translation criticism
- translator – a specialist or a philologist with professional expertise

An interdisciplinary approach to the conference topic would be most welcome. It is our wish to make this conference a meeting place for the exchange of experiences, research methods, views as well as a good place for fruitful discussions.
